Tuesday 1st October- Timetable Rock star launch. The children are invited to come to school dressed like a rock star as we have a day of focusing on maths and timetables.

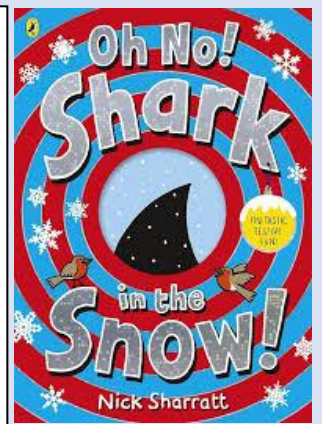

In pre-school, the children have been enjoying lots of activities based on our book of the week 'Oh no, Shark in the snow' We've had fun using binoculars to hunt for sharks outside, and used rice and shaving foam to represent snow that felt, sounded and smelt exciting.
